You must have a My C-SPAN account for free downloads.

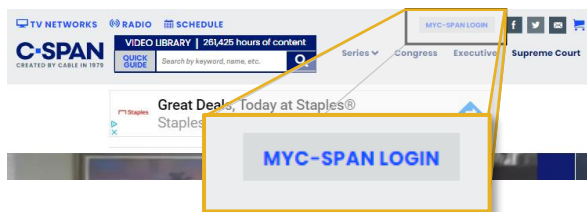

Creating a My C-SPAN Account is free and provides the following benefits:

- **Bookmarks:** Click the bookmark icon to follow C-SPAN content and save it to your profile page.
- **Clips:** Creating a clip with a My C-SPAN Account saves the clip to your profile page for easy access.
- **Email Notifications:** Subscribe to email notifications to receive updates about bookmarked content.
- **Video Recommendations:** View recommended programs based on your bookmarked content.
- **Free Downloads:** Download four full Congressional Sessions and Hearings up to four hours in length each month.
- **Free Clip Downloads:** Download five free clips up to five minutes in length from each program. There is no limit on the number of free clips allowed from Congressional Sessions and Hearings.

To create your account, click on the My C-SPAN Login.

It is recommended that if you have a .edu email address to use it for your C-SPAN Account.

## Using Video Clips in Your Presentation

If you are giving a presentation, we encourage you to download and include your video or audio in PowerPoint or Keynote. This will ensure that it plays quickly with no waiting.

You may have noticed that C-SPAN has begun to include ads at the beginning of programs. This is not the case with clips or with downloads.

If you cannot or choose not to download and embed the video clips, you can include a link. You do this by making the clip, copying the URL, inserting it as a hyperlink in your PowerPoint or Keynote. This is a little slower but does work. Again, there will be no ad if it is a clip.

## Rules for free downloads.

### VIDEO CLIPS

#### Congressional Sessions or Committee Hearings

- Unlimited free clips
- Clips must be 5 minutes or less in length

#### All Other Program Clips

- Up to 5 clips per program
- Clips must be less than 5 minutes in length

### FULL VIDEO PROGRAMS

#### Congressional Sessions or Committee Hearings

- Download up to four full programs each month
- Full programs must be less than 4 hours in length

*Whole programs are long and tie up resources to download so they are limited.*

## Download Permission Reference

You can create video clips from most videos in the C-SPAN Digital Library, however, some video clips cannot be downloaded. For video clips that cannot be downloaded, the video is still available and viewable using the C-SPAN video clip link.

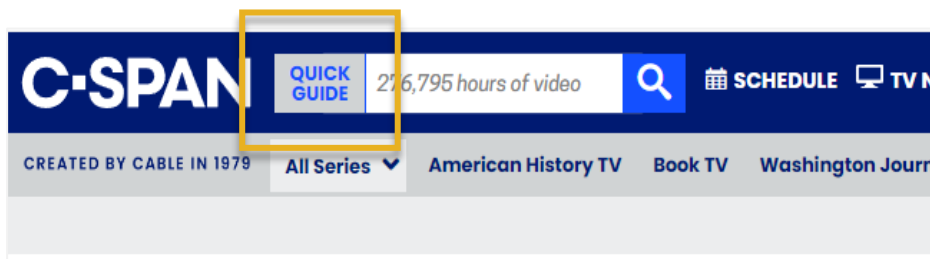

## EXAMPLE – from the QUICK GUIDE select HOUSE COMMITTEES

All the House Committees results will appear under the VIDEOS tab first.

Use the filter boxes and/or tabs on the left to further refine your search results or select one of the tabs at the top to view results by CLIPS, PEOPLE, ORGANIZATION, MENTIONS, or BILLS.

You can also sort the results by when the program aired, when it was recorded, best match, most popular, or most views.

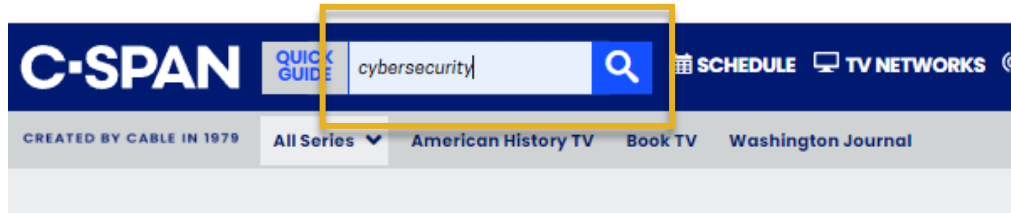

## C-SPAN Archives Research – Getting Started

To begin a new search, input your search term(s).



The first page you see is a limited, broad overview of general search results.

To refine your search for better results, select one of the tabs listed at the top of the page.

The general search is recommended when conducting a limited, broad search. It is NOT recommended for targeted searches or for scholarly research.

## C-SPAN Archives Research – Refining the Search

The VIDEOS tab refines the search by looking for the search term within the Title and Description of the video which is highlighted in yellow.

Use the filter boxes and/or tabs on the left to further refine your search results. You can also sort the results by when the program aired, when it was recorded, best match, most popular, or most views.

Because the VIDEOS search does not pull data from within the transcript VIDEOS search results should be used for broad or general topic searches.

## C-SPAN Archives Research – Refining the Search

The CLIPS tab refines the search by pulling user-created video clips from the original full-length program.

As with the VIDEOS search the results are limited. The data is pulled from the original program title and description and not from within the transcript.

Use the filter boxes and/or tabs on the left to further refine your search results. You can also sort the results by when the program aired, when it was recorded, best match, most popular, or most views.

CLIPS search results should be used for broad or general topic searches.

The PEOPLE tab refines the search by finding people whose C-SPAN profile page descriptions include the search term.

Use the filter boxes and/or tabs on the left to further refine your search results. You can also sort the results.

PEOPLE search results are best used when looking for a specific individual.

ORGANIZATION search results are best used when looking for a specific organization such as congressional committees, government departments, NGOs, and etc...





## C-SPAN Archives Research – Refining the Search

The MENTIONS tab refines the search by looking for the search terms within the Transcript. This expands the results to include every instance in which the search terms are mentioned within videos. The results are targeted to the section of the program video in which the search terms appear.

Use the filter boxes and/or tabs on the left to further refine your search results. You can also sort the results by when the program aired, when it was recorded, best match, most popular, or most views.

MENTIONS search results are best used for research or when looking for the largest quantity of results for key word(s).

## C-SPAN Archives Research – Refining the Search

The **BILLS** tab refines the search by looking for all Congressional bills in which the search terms are included. The data is pulled from the title or description of the bill.


The results identify the bill’s title or description, the Congress term, bill sponsor, as well as legislative action or status.

Use the filter boxes and/or tabs on the left to further refine your search results. You can also sort the results.

**BILLS** search results are recommended for use when looking for legislation, legislative action, bill sponsors, amendments, policy area, or status of a bill.

TSA HAS PLAYED A VITAL ROLE SINCE 9/11 OF COURSE, IN COMBATting TERRORISM AND ENSURING THAT OUR AVIATION AND TRANSPORTATION SYSTEMS ARE PROTECTED. AS I WALK THROUGH THE TSA LINE, WHICH I DO TWICE A WEEK, I SAY THANK YOU FOR PROTECTING US. BECAUSE THAT'S WHAT YOU DO. WE APPRECIATE THAT AND WE HAVE FOUGHT TO TRY TO HELP ENSURE THAT YOUR TSA PERSONNEL ARE TREATED APPROPRIATELY IN THE FEDERAL GOVERNMENT, LAW ENFORCEMENT CONTEXT. WE WANT TO DO MORE IN THAT REGARD. SO, WE APPRECIATE YOUR WORK AND THE DILIGENCE THAT THE TSA WORK FOR US THAT. IF YOU LOOK AT THE RECORD, ALTHOUGH GEO AND OTHERS HAVE HOPE TO MAKE YOUR SYSTEM WORK BETTER BY PUTTING OUT FLAWS, WE HAVE BEEN BLESSED WITH NOT HAVING THE KINDS OF INCIDENTS THAT EVERYONE FEARED WE WOULD HAVE REPEATEDLY AFTER 9/11. I WILL SAY THAT 9/11 TYPE THREATS, HAVING BEEN REALLY BE THE GREATEST CHALLENGE IN THE REASON TSA WAS BULKED UP AND APPROPRIATELY -- THOSE THREATS HAVE EVOLVED OVER TIME. SPECIFICALLY, I WANT TO TALK TO YOU ABOUT HOW TSA NEEDS TO REALIGN TO MEET THOSE OF ALL BEING THREATS. THEIR JOB IS NOT JUST TO PROTECT OUR AIRPORTS AND AIR TRAVELERS, BUT ALSO THE NATION SURFACE TRANSPORTATION SYSTEMS. AND SO, COLONIAL PIPELINE, YOU MAY KNOW, IT'S A BIG ISSUE OF CONCERN WITH THIS COMMITTEE. WE HAD HEARINGS ON, IT WE'VE DRAFTED LEGISLATION, ACTUALLY ENACTED SOME LEGISLATION TO HELP DEAL WITH THAT KIND OF THREAT. EXPOSE VULNERABILITIES AND TSA'S OVERSIGHT OF OUR NATION'S SURFACE TRANSPORTATION SYSTEM, SPECIFICALLY THE PIPELINES BUT, MORE BROADLY, THAT RANSOMWARE ATTACK AT COLONIAL PIPELINE WAS THE LARGEST ATTACK ON OIL INFRASTRUCTURE IN THE HISTORY OF THE COUNTRY. IT ALSO PROMPTED YOU TO ISSUE THE FIRST EVER CYBER SECURITY--RELATED SECURITY DIRECTIVES FOR OWNERS AND OPERATORS OF PIPELINES THAT REQUIRE MANDATORY REPORTING AND MITIGATION MEASURES.
