Box it up!

Post Office Boxes have been around for a long time, but lately they're enjoying a resurgence in popularity.



And they should be. Post Office Boxes offer our customers many benefits. Typically, mail for PO Boxes is posted in the morning, meaning customers get their mail earlier in the day. Extended lobby hours in many Post Offices are making PO Boxes more accessible to customers who can't visit us during regular business hours. And "Post Office Box Availability" tags are letting customers in our lobbies know that boxes are available for rent immediately.

Customers who can't make it to our lobbies can go online to check for available PO Boxes at www.usps.com/poboxes. Search by either ZIP Code or address for a list of the closest Post Offices with available box sizes and associated six-month box fees.

Increasing our Express Mail reach

As part of the Postal Service's ongoing efforts to promote Express Mail, two postal areas announced significant improvements to their overnight reach — a crucial part of making the Postal Service's premier product more attractive to customers.

The Northeast and New York Metro Areas have both announced changes that put them on track to meet the organization's national target of 85 percent overnight delivery by April.

In the Northeast Area, 271 more ZIP Code pairs have been upgraded from two-day to next-day. Other improvements include checking office times at retail acceptance units to ensure that overnight reach for both air and surface destinations have been addressed independently of each other in the directories. Retail acceptance unit closing times also were extended to match the time retail counters close, to ensure that customers in retail lobbies around

closing time still get a next-day commitment on their Express Mail.

The New York Metro Area upgraded 57 five-digit ZIP Codes from 3 P.M. to noon next-day service, and proposed later standard times for retail acceptance units for 418 ZIP Codes.

New York Metro has only two districts with five-digit offices — Caribbean and Westchester — that aren't able to provide 100-percent next-day delivery due to transportation issues and their location. Still, fifteen ZIP Codes in the Caribbean and ten in Westchester will be upgraded from two-day to next-day service.

Taking a bite out of ID theft

The Postal Service has delivered an important letter from PMG Jack Potter to the country's 121 million households urging Americans to guard against identity theft.



Potter said he was pleased a recent Federal Trade Commission (FTC) survey on identity theft concluded that only 2 percent of all victims reported the theft was connected to the mail. "But that's still too many," Potter wrote.

Now, USPS is teaming with the FTC to fight ID theft. "We will keep working to make the mail even more secure and strive to reduce that percentage to zero," Potter wrote. "Your identity is valuable. If someone steals it to commit fraudulent acts, it can affect every aspect of your life — your credit standing, your ability to buy a car or house, even get a job or medical care."

The Postal Service has distributed an FTC brochure providing tips and tools to help Americans protect their identities. Mailed with Potter's letter, the brochure also includes information to help people who become victims of identity theft.

USPS joins HBO to promote John Adams miniseries

USPS and Home Box Office (HBO) are jointly promoting the upcoming cable network's miniseries, John Adams, and National Card and Letter Writing Month.

The HBO production is based on the book *John Adams*, by Pulitzer Prize winner David McCullough. The best-selling biography of the founding father centers on the letters Adams and his wife, Abigail, wrote each other during their courtship and 54-year marriage.

USPS has launched a multifaceted 60-day campaign highlighting the HBO series' focus on the Adams' family letters and encouraging Americans to rediscover letter writing — especially in March during National Card and Letter Writing Month.

The USPS campaign includes a national cancellation featuring an Adams quote, "Let us dare to read, think, speak and write," and a new Web site — www.poweroftheletter.com. Postal receipts from point-of-service terminals and Automated Postal Centers will include the Adams quote and the Web site. Standees and window clings will appear in nearly 12,000 Post Offices around the country promoting the Web site and the miniseries.

HBO will premiere its seven-part miniseries with two episodes on Sunday evening, March 16. Episodes 3–7 will air the subsequent five Sundays, with the series ending April 20.

Business development teams go from pilot to permanent

The results are in, and the business development teams (BDTs) tested in 34 districts last year have been an overwhelming success. Now, every district will have a permanent BDT in place.

BDT members helped generate new revenue and retain current customers. They also improved customer satisfaction and strengthened Business Connect and Customer Connect participation, according to Deputy PMG Pat Donahoe.

"More than ever, we need to focus our efforts on building customer loyalty and profitability," said Donahoe. "I would like to thank the 34 managers who took the lead to prove the BDTs a success. Your efforts have set the stage for our organization as we move forward to meet customer needs in a competitive environment."

New BDT managers will be appointed in most districts. The Postal Service will also hire additional small business specialists in all districts. Each team will report to its district marketing manager. The full-scale program should be in place by April.

Fact Sheet: Pay Postage and Print Labels

Print shipping labels — and pay for postage via credit card — from the convenience of your home or office. Click-N-Ship[®] service (www.usps.com/clicknship) brings the Post Office to your office. You can print labels for domestic and international expedited services — Priority Mail[®], Express Mail[®], Express Mail International[®], Priority Mail International[™], and Global Express Guaranteed[®] (GXG[®]). As an added benefit, you get free Delivery Confirmation[™] service with every Priority Mail label you print, and Express Mail labels include signature proof of delivery. Signature Confirmation[™] service is available for a small fee. Purchase USPS[®] insurance online to insure your domestic and international shipments. Get shipping supplies online from The Postal Store[®] at no cost. No monthly fee is required to print labels or postage using Click-N-Ship service.

Do you need a complete mailing and shipping solution? Are you shipping higher mail volumes? Are you shipping multiple packages frequently? Then check out the approved PC Postage[®] product vendors at www.usps.com/onlinepostage. With PC Postage software, you can purchase postage over the Internet and use your standard desktop printer to print the PC Postage indicia directly onto envelopes or labels for your letters or packages.

Mailing is as convenient as your neighborhood mailbox. You can drop your domestic Express Mail and Priority Mail pieces with PC Postage online labels in any Postal Service collection box, take them to your local Post Office, hand them to your carrier, or schedule a pickup online. However, if you have a package that uses postage stamps and that weighs 13 ounces or more, or an international mail package

that uses online postage, you can leave it for your mail carrier to pick up, but you cannot deposit it into a street letter collection box.

Fact Sheet: Request Package Pickup

USPS.com provides you with two options at www.usps.com/pickup to have your Priority Mail, Express Mail, and international services packages picked up by a carrier. These options are Carrier Pickup[™] service and Pickup on Demand[®] service. Just prepare your packages for shipping — including postage — and go online to request package pickup. Use Carrier Pickup service to have your carrier pick up packages at no extra charge during normal mail delivery anytime from the next day to up to 3 months in advance. If you need your packages picked up sooner, use Pickup on Demand service — the pickup is usually made within 2 hours of the request for only \$14.25 per pickup, regardless of the number of packages. You can also use Pickup on Demand service to request a pickup within a scheduled time frame (rather than during normal mail delivery) up to 6 days in advance.

Send Shipments Around the World

The Postal Service provides four international delivery options — Global Express Guaranteed, Express Mail International, Priority Mail International, and First-Class Mail International[™] — to more than 190 countries with reliable service, convenience, and no fuel surcharges. For more information about international shipping, go to www.usps.com/international. You can print labels with discounted postage for the following USPS international services:

- Global Express Guaranteed — 10-percent online discount.
- Express Mail International — 8-percent online discount.
- Priority Mail International — 5-percent online discount.

Customs forms are integrated with the online shipping labels, so there is no need for additional forms. However, if you need only customs forms for international and/or APO/FPO shipments, they are available online at <https://webapps.usps.com/customsforms>.

Track Packages and Confirm Deliveries

You can check online for the delivery status of your mailing at www.usps.com/shipping/trackandconfirm.htm. Tracking provides progress information on Express Mail, Global Express Guaranteed, Express Mail International, and Priority Mail International packages while enroute to their destination.

Our low cost Delivery Confirmation service gives you the date, ZIP Code, and time your article was delivered. If delivery was attempted, you will get the date and time of attempted delivery. You can easily access this information online with our "Track & Confirm" tool at www.usps.com/shipping/trackandconfirm.htm. Delivery Confirmation service may be used with the following items: First-Class Mail® parcels; Priority Mail items; Package Services parcels including Parcel Post®, Media Mail®, Bound Printed Matter, and Library Mail; Standard Mail parcels weighing less than 16 ounces and mailed at the electronic rate; and Parcel Select® packages mailed at the electronic rate.

You can also get online confirmation of the delivery of packages with Signature Confirmation, Certified Mail™, and Registered Mail™ service. See www.usps.com/shipping/trackandconfirm.htm for more details.

Fact Sheet: Compare Postage Rates

Now you can calculate postage right from your computer using the rate calculator at www.usps.com/tools/calculatepostage. Have the size, shape, weight, and ZIP Code (for domestic mailing) of your mailing ready, and easily calculate postage rates and delivery times for domestic, international, and all discount mail. In one convenient place, you can compare the cost and speed, for example, of mailing the same parcel by First-Class Mail, Priority Mail, Parcel Post, or Express Mail service.

Fact Sheet: Add Insurance

Now you can add insurance to your Click-N-Ship service labels. Available online at www.usps.com/clicknship for Priority Mail and Express Mail labels printed with postage, coverage is available for up to \$500 upon payment of applicable fees. Express Mail service provides coverage for the first \$100 at no additional cost. Items must be properly packaged. Insurance is not available for items that are perishable, flammable, or too fragile to withstand normal handling in the mail. If you have insured an item online, you can mail it at a Post Office, hand it to your carrier, request free package pickup online, or drop it in a USPS collection box. Go to www.usps.com/insurance/online.htm for more information about online insurance.

For insurance coverage of more than \$500, you may purchase retail insurance at a Post Office. Retail insurance provides coverage up to \$5,000 and may not be combined with online insurance. Registered Mail service provides coverage up to \$25,000.

File a Domestic Insurance Claim Online

For domestic insurance (up to \$500) purchased online through Click-N-Ship service, the mailer or the addressee

can file a claim online — providing a faster claims process and access anytime to view the claim status and history. It's easy! Go to www.usps.com/insuranceclaims/online.htm to get started.

Once you register or sign in, all you need is the following:

- Your insurance article number.
- Your transaction number (for Click-N-Ship claims) or the auction number (for eBay claims).
- Proof of value (all claims) and proof of damage (damaged claims/missing contents only).

Note: Damaged items (including mailing container and packaging materials) must still be presented at the Post Office after submitting your online claim. Visit *Mailing Standards of the United States Postal Service*, Domestic Mail Manual (DMM®) part 609 for more information about submitting proof of value and proof of damage.

- Claim description and details for loss or damaged claim.

Express Mail and Priority Mail packaging have been awarded Cradle to Cradle Certification for their environmental attributes. The Postal Service is committed to finding new ways to protect the environment and is the first in its industry to receive this certification.

At www.usps.com/createmail, the Postal Service offers a suite of hybrid services that start out online and become hardcopy direct mail. All you need is a credit card and an Internet connection. No permits, fees, or forms are required, and your mailing is guaranteed to be USPS-compliant. Here's how it works: You bring your ideas, a list of addresses (you can even buy targeted custom mailing lists at affordable prices), and a credit card to USPS.com. You choose the format, such as a postcard, letter, flyer, or greeting card. Each mailpiece is personalized, printed, prepared, and in the mail the next business day.

- Print newsletters, postcards, brochures, flyers, booklets, and more — all online through Click2Mail at

www.usps.com/maillingonline. Click2Mail is a powerful printing and mailing service combining the speed of the Internet with the effectiveness of traditional mail. Click2Mail offers an array of printing and mailing options to customize your order. How does Click2Mail work? You submit documents and mailing lists electronically using Click2Mail, and then the electronic files are securely transmitted to print sites nearest the recipients' address. The documents are printed and addressed, postage is applied, and the documents are transported to the Post Office for processing and delivery.

- Prepare and send glossy, full-color postcards through NetPost PremiumPostcard™ at www.usps.com/premiumpostcard. Premium postcards are great for announcements, thank you notes, invitations, business-related marketing pieces, and more. You can choose from thousands of available images or upload your own photographs and images on a glossy postcard. You can send a personal message to each recipient while easily mailing to your entire address list. The price includes custom personalization, printing, and mailing services.
- Create and send high-quality personalized greeting cards from your desktop through CardStore at www.usps.com/cardstore. CardStore has an extensive library of images for you to choose from, or you can upload your own photographs, logos, and images to be printed on the greeting cards. Select a card and personalize it, and CardStore will print and mail your cards for you to anywhere in the world. You can also turn your greeting card into a gift by adding a gift card from a variety of retailers, such as Barnes & Noble Booksellers, Circuit City, Starbucks Coffee, and Bed, Bath and Beyond.

To use *Movers Guide* online, you need an e-mail address, and to prevent fraud, the Postal Service charges a \$1.00 fee via credit card to verify identities. You can also print out forms online and then submit them at no cost —

just place them in a collection box, leave them for your regular letter carrier, or drop them off at a Post Office.

The Postal Service offers you several options to manage your mail when you are away from home. The fastest growing service is Premium Forwarding Service (PFS), a personal service for residents who wish to have all their mail forwarded to a temporary address. Most mail is reshipped weekly in a Priority Mail package, while other items, including Express Mail, Registered Mail, and Certified Mail items, are reshipped immediately to the temporary address. PFS is available for periods ranging from 2 weeks to 1 year for an application fee of \$10.00 and a weekly reshipping fee of \$11.95. For more details, see www.usps.com/receive/premiumforwarding.

You can put your mail on hold online at www.usps.com/holdmail. Whether you are on vacation or on an unexpected business trip, you can rest easy knowing your mail is safely held for you at your local Post Office. This online service will electronically notify your local Post Office to hold your mail. For same-day service, submit your online request by 2 A.M. CT Monday through Saturday. Mail can be held from 3 to 30 days. Normal delivery of your mail will resume on the date you specify. Online access to request this service is currently limited to certain ZIP Codes. Just enter your 5-digit ZIP Code to verify that your Post Office participates.

You can schedule redelivery of packages or special service mail that you missed through our redelivery service feature available online at www.usps.com/redelivery. You can request to have the mailpiece redelivered, or you can arrange to pick it up from your Post Office. For same-day service, submit your online request by 2 A.M. CT Monday through Saturday.

Our reply mail feature at www.usps.com/replymail helps you create a distinct mailpiece online that can improve your mail campaign and simplify work for graphic designers and printers. You can choose from Business Reply Mail® (BRM), Qualified Business Reply Mail (QBRM), or Courtesy Reply Mail™ (CRM), and complete the following tasks:

- Apply for a permit.
- Pay initial permit fees online.
- Create and download mailpiece designs (PDF and EPS formats).
- Store mailpieces online.
- Store graphics, images, and logos.

Customized Postage™ at www.usps.com/postagesolutions lets you personalize your postage with pictures or images that capture fond memories and help make your card or letter much more personal. You can

Events Guide

Helpful Hints for Off-Site Events

Step 1: Prepare for the Event

Estimate Audience Size

Determine how many customers will be coming to your event and use this information to plan your setup and to order appropriate materials and refreshments. There is generally a 1–2 percent response rate to direct mail campaigns.

Order Enough Materials

Depending on the number of participants, you will need to order an appropriate amount of literature for handout materials and giveaways (if applicable). You may order advertising materials about USPS.com on the Business Connect Data Center under the “order supply” tab. These handouts are also available through MessageMaker3. Contact your area advertising coordinator for assistance with MessageMaker3 orders.

Plan Your Demonstration — How to Keep Your Audience's Attention

- Keep in mind that beginnings and endings are peak attention times for the audience and merit special attention.
- Identify the purpose or goal of your presentation — in this case, using the Quick, Easy, Convenient features of USPS.com to save small business owners time.
- Tie the purpose or goal to a relevant real-life experience of yourself or one of your customers.
- Ask questions to stimulate thinking and encourage audience participation.
- At the end of the presentation, keep in mind that your audience needs a sense of closure, including key takeaways, such as the theme of the meeting — Today's Mail Needs USPS.com.

Step 2: Set Up Computers

Be sure you arrange for computers well in advance of your event and that you have the appropriate hook-ups, with access to the Internet. Also be sure you have trained employees to help you with the demonstrations. It's important to have local presence whenever possible to engage as many customers as possible. By leveraging your local resources, the event becomes a team effort. Some possible representatives include the following:

- Other postmasters, station or branch managers, or Postal Service ambassadors.
- Small business specialists or business development team members.
- A customer relations coordinator to assist with the presentation and customer-relationship building.
- Members of your local Postal Customer Council® or Customer Advisory Council.

Make sure you discuss the roles of the Postal Service representatives prior to your event.

Step 3: Conduct the Demonstration**Set Up**

You can display literature or materials and set up the refreshments in advance. It will take some time to make sure things are properly set up. People will start to arrive up to 15 minutes early, and you want to make sure you are prepared to greet them.

Welcome Participants

This will create a more relaxed atmosphere and give you the opportunity to learn about individual business challenges so you can better address real customer objectives.

Make a sign-in sheet (see page [14](#)) available to your attendees prior to the start of your session. This sheet also has a column to record any specific product or service interests a customer might have. Bring a stack of your business cards to hand out. Ask your small business specialist for suggestions or assistance.

Allow for Networking and Questions

Allow time for customers to network with each other and to ask you questions.

Step 4: Conduct Followup

Ensure timely followup to any customer requests or inquiries that were not resolved at your meeting.

Step 5: Document Your Activities in the Business Connect Data Center

ASM Revision: Passport Application Acceptance Service

Effective February 28, 2008, we are revising *Administrative Support Manual* 422.2 to remove current text and to designate the section as “Reserved.”

A rule that was published in the *Federal Register* on November 19, 2007 (Volume 72, pages 64930–64939), and that became effective February 1, 2008, reorganized, restructured, and updated passport regulations to better reflect current practice and changes in statutory authority and to remove outdated provisions. This rule requires that the Postal Service™ revise the current ASM 422.2. Until the revision is ready, the section will be designated “Reserved.”

Consequently, the article titled “ASM Revision: Passport Application Acceptance Service at Designated Post Offices” in *Postal Bulletin* 22215 (9-13-07, pages 14–23) is rescinded.

DMM Revision: Automation Compatibility Requirements for Enhanced Carrier Route Letter-Size Standard Mail

Effective March 3, 2008, we are revising 243.6.1.2 of the *Mailing Standards of the United States Postal Service*, Domestic Mail Manual (DMM®) to clarify the basic standards that describe letter-size enhanced carrier route Standard Mail® items. In addition to the current basic eligibility standards, pieces prepared with a delivery address must comply with all of the standards for automation compatibility in 201.3 and must bear an 11-digit barcode. These requirements are included in the rate eligibility standards for each type of enhanced carrier route mail, but are not stated in the basic requirements.

DMM Revision: Priority Mail Reshipment — Available for Mail Sent to Street Addresses

Effective March 3, 2008, the Postal Service™ is revising *Mailing Standards of the United States Postal Service, Domestic Mail Manual (DMM®) 507.10.7* to remove a restriction on the mail that can be gathered by the Postal Service before delivery and reshipped via Priority Mail® reshipment service. Previous to this change, Priority Mail reshipment was available only for mail originally addressed to Post Office™ boxes. We encourage customers who are Merchandise Return Service permit holders to use our Priority Mail reshipment service, which is now available to mail addressed to Post Office boxes and to business street addresses.

10.7 Priority Mail Reshipment

10.7.1 Description

[Revise text of 10.7.1 as follows:]

An authorized permit holder may use merchandise return service to have mail (previously sent at First-Class Mail and Package Services prices) reshipped by Priority Mail to the post office where the permit is held. The permit holder must make a written request for reshipment and send the request to the postmaster where the Merchandise Return Service permit is authorized, specifying how often the reshipments are to be made from each affected postal facility. Reshipment is activated by the use of tags and

address labels provided by the permit holder to those designated postal facilities that the permit holder authorizes to reship the mail by Priority Mail Merchandise Return Service.

[Revise heading and text of 10.7.2 as follows:]

10.7.2 Reshipment Service

The USPS gathers mail addressed to post office boxes or business street addresses and dispatches it as a Priority Mail Merchandise Return Service shipment based on the written request and agreement between the USPS and the mailer, subject to these standards:

- a. Service frequency is scheduled.
- b. Priority Mail postage and fees are paid against the Merchandise Return Service permit. The sack or container and its contents are considered a single piece for calculation of the Priority Mail rate of postage and must not exceed 70 lbs.
- c. The mailer must keep a postage-due, Merchandise Return Service account, or business reply mail account at the postal facility where the post office box or business street address is located for any shortpaid, Merchandise Return Service, or business reply mail. The letter of request must state that such an account exists.
- d. Priority Mail reshipment service is not available for Registered Mail, Certified Mail, COD, Insured Mail, or Express Mail items. The mailer must give instructions for redirecting such items on a PS Form 1093, *Application for Post Office Box or Caller Service*, for mail originally addressed to post office boxes or in the letter of request for mail originally addressed to business street addresses.
- e. The written request by the customer must list the postmaster at the originating office as the “Firm Representative” and show the pickup time is when the USPS employee gathers the mail and prepares it for dispatch as Priority Mail Merchandise Return Service.

f. A written request to the postmaster by the customer to terminate the agreement must be submitted 30 days in advance.

10.7.3 Sack Tag

[Revise text of 10.7.3 as follows:]

If a sack is used as the mail container for Priority Mail reshipment, the permit holder must provide a tag and an address label containing the delivery address of the postage due unit at the post office where the permit is held, the permit holder’s address, and a space for the customer’s return address, and otherwise meet the format standards in 10.6 for each affected postal facility. The sack or container

and its contents are considered a single piece for calculation of the Priority Mail rate of postage.

The new flat-rate box is identified by the words “Large Flat Rate Box” printed on the packaging. A lower postage rate for APO/FPO ZIP Code[™] destinations provides an opportunity for the Postal

 - \$10.95 is charged for material sent in a Priority Mail large flat-rate box to APO/FPO destination addresses.
 - \$12.95 is charged for material sent in a Priority Mail large flat-rate box to domestic destinations.

Articles mailed to an APO/FPO address in one of the regular flat-rate boxes (FRB-1 or FRB-2) are charged \$8.95. Only USPS-produced flat-rate boxes are eligible for the flat-rate box prices.

DMM Revision: Premium Forwarding Service

Effective March 2, 2008, Premium Forwarding Service (PFS) is a permanent mail classification in section 507.3.0 of *Mailing Standards of the United States Postal Service*, Domestic Mail Manual (DMM®). We end the experiment at midnight on March 1, 2008, and implement the permanent classification and fees.

PFS is a personalized service for reshipping mail from a customer's primary address to a temporary address on a weekly basis using Priority Mail® service. With PFS, the Postal Service™ reships mail to customers who are away for at least 2 weeks and up to 1 year.

There are no major changes in the permanent PFS classification compared with the experimental service offering.

There were two minor changes made to the DMM language. The name of the fee charged to customers when they apply to use PFS is now referred to as an "application fee" for consistency. Also, the references to oversized parcels in renumbered sections 3.3.7 (formerly 709.4.3.7) and 3.4.1 (formerly 709.4.4.1) were removed due to redundancy. Although the references to oversized parcels have been removed from the aforementioned sections, any oversized parcel not requiring a scan or signature or arriving postage due at the primary address is still charged the appropriate oversized Parcel Post® rate.

3.0 Premium Forwarding Service

3.1 Rates and Fees

3.1.1 Application Fee

Customers must pay a \$10.00 nonrefundable application fee.

3.1.2 Weekly Reshipment Charge

The reshipment charge for each Priority Mail shipment to one temporary address is \$11.95 for each week of service requested. The amount due for the total weeks requested must be paid in full at the time the application is received.

3.1.3 Extension of Service

A Premium Forwarding Service (PFS) customer may contact the post office responsible for delivery to the primary address prior to the last shipment date and extend PFS service (up to 1 year maximum service from the initial start date) as needed. An extension is processed only after the post office receives payment of the reshipment charges due for the total weeks of extension requested.

3.1.4 Early Termination of Service

A customer who terminates PFS early (e.g., a customer prepays for 10 weeks but returns to a primary address after 8 weeks, either temporarily or permanently) may request a refund for any unused weekly shipment charges from the post office serving the primary address. The application fee is nonrefundable.

3.2 Basic Standards

3.2.1 Description

Premium Forwarding Service (PFS) provides residential delivery customers and certain post office box customers an option to have all mail addressed to their primary address reshipped or rerouted to a temporary address mainly by means of a weekly Priority Mail shipment. PFS is available for a period of not less than 2 weeks and not more than 1 year. This optional service is separate from the piece-by-piece forwarding service offered in 2.0, whereby only certain mailpieces are forwarded.

3.2.2 Use

Participation in PFS is subject to the following standards:

- PFS is available to residential delivery customers and to post office box customers with a size-one or size-two post office box.
- A customer must submit a completed PFS application, Form 8176, *Premium Forwarding Service (PFS) Application*, as specified by the Postal Service. The application fee and weekly reshipment charges for the full duration of the requested service must accompany the application.
- Except as provided in 3.2.2d, customers must designate on the application whether the order is for an "Individual" or an "Entire Household."
- For customers whose primary address is a post office box, only the box customer is authorized to initiate the application and "Entire Household" must be designated on the application.
- PFS is available for a period of not less than 2 weeks and not more than 1 year.
- PFS is available only from and to domestic addresses.

- g. PFS is available to, but not from, single-point central delivery addresses such as RV parks, hospitals, hotels, and U.S. Department of State addresses. See 703.3.0 for additional U.S. Department of State requirements.

3.2.3 Prohibited Use

PFS cannot be combined with any ancillary or extra services beyond those purchased by the original sender. In addition, PFS is not available for:

- a. Customers who have an active temporary or permanent change of address (COA).
- b. Customers who have an active Hold Mail Authorization (PS Form 8076). Mail that has previously been held at the primary address post office cannot be included in PFS reshipments to a customer's temporary address.
- c. Customers whose primary address is a size-three, size-four, or size-five post office box. Residential customers who use these post office box sizes due to the unavailability of smaller boxes may request a waiver of this restriction.
- d. Customers whose primary address is a business delivery address.
- e. Customers whose primary address is a central point to which the USPS provides delivery in bulk to a third party, such as a commercial mail receiving agency (CMRA), RV park, trailer park, or hotel.
- f. Customers whose primary address or temporary address is an APO or FPO.
- g. Customers whose temporary address is within the 969 3-digit ZIP Code area or is otherwise in a U.S. territory or possession that requires a customs declaration.

3.3 Preparation

3.3.1 Weekly Priority Mail Reshipments

Regardless of any mailer's ancillary service endorsement on a mailpiece, all mail is reshipped in the weekly Priority Mail shipment, except as specified in 3.3.2 through 3.4.1.

3.3.2 Mailpieces Arriving at the Primary Address Endorsed "Surface Mail Only" or With Other Hazardous Materials Markings

Any mailpiece arriving at the primary address that indicates surface only transportation such as Label 127, *Surface Mail Only*, or bears other hazardous materials markings such as "Consumer Commodity ORM-D", cannot be reshipped in the weekly Priority Mail shipment and must be rerouted separately via surface transportation.

3.3.3 Mailpieces Requiring a Scan or Signature at Delivery

Mailpieces requiring a scan or signature at delivery, such as Express Mail, Certified Mail, numbered insured mail, or mailpieces with Delivery Confirmation, are appropriately scanned, then rerouted immediately and separately to the temporary address, subject to the following:

- a. Express Mail, Priority Mail, and First-Class Mail are rerouted at no additional charge.
- b. Standard Mail parcels are separately rerouted postage due at the appropriate 1-pound Parcel Post single-piece rate.
- c. Package Services mailpieces (Parcel Post, Bound Printed Matter, Media Mail, and Library Mail) are separately rerouted postage due at the appropriate single-piece rate in the subclass in which the mailpiece was originally shipped. For Parcel Select items, the applicable rate is the Parcel Post rate.

3.3.4 Priority Mail Not Requiring a Scan or Signature at Delivery

Priority Mail that does not require a scan or signature at delivery is immediately and separately rerouted to the temporary address, unless it will fit into the weekly Priority Mail shipment and such inclusion does not delay its delivery to the temporary address.

3.3.5 Large First-Class Mail and Periodicals Parcels Not Requiring a Scan or Signature at Delivery

First-Class Mail and Periodicals parcels (firm bundles) not requiring a scan or signature at delivery and that do not fit into the weekly Priority Mail shipment are separately rerouted at no additional charge.

3.3.6 Standard Mail Parcels Not Requiring a Scan or Signature at Delivery

Eligible Standard Mail parcels that do not require a scan or signature at delivery are included in the weekly Priority Mail shipment provided they will fit. Parcels that do not fit or are otherwise ineligible (e.g., mailpieces identified as surface transportation only) are separately rerouted postage due at the appropriate 1-pound Parcel Post single-piece rate.

3.3.7 Package Services Mailpieces Not Requiring a Scan or Signature at Delivery

Package Services mailpieces not requiring a scan or signature at delivery are separately rerouted postage due at the appropriate single-piece rate in the subclass in which the mailpiece was originally shipped. For Parcel Select items, the applicable rate is the Parcel Post rate.

3.4 Enter and Deposit

3.4.1 Mailpieces Arriving Postage Due at the Primary Address

Any mailpiece arriving postage due at the Post Office serving a customer's primary address is not reshipped in the weekly Priority Mail shipment and will be rerouted individually. Mailpieces arriving postage due are rerouted as follows:

- a. Postage due First-Class Mail mailpieces are rerouted as First-Class Mail postage due. Only the original postage due amount is collected. There is no additional charge for rerouting the mailpiece.
- b. Postage due Priority Mail mailpieces are rerouted as Priority Mail postage due. Only the original postage due amount is collected. There is no additional charge for rerouting the mailpiece.
- c. Postage due Package Services mailpieces are rerouted postage due at the appropriate single-piece rate in the subclass in which the mailpiece was originally shipped. For Parcel Select items, the applicable rate is the Parcel Post rate. The total postage due for Package Services mailpieces is the

sum of the postage due at the time of receipt at the primary address plus the postage due for rerouting the mailpiece from the primary post office to the temporary address at the appropriate single-piece rate.

DMM Revision: Express Mail Reshipment — Available for Mail Sent to Business Street Addresses

Effective March 3, 2008, the Postal Service[™] is revising *Mailing Standards of the United States Postal Service, Domestic Mail Manual (DMM[®])* 507.5.6.1 and 705.17.0 to remove a restriction on the mail that can be gathered by the Postal Service before delivery and reshipped via Express Mail[®] reshipment service. Previous to this change, this service was available only for mail originally addressed to Post Office[™] boxes. We encourage customers who are Express Mail Corporate Account holders to use Express Mail reshipment service, which is now available to mail addressed to Post Office boxes and to business street addresses.

The USPS gathers mail addressed to post office boxes or business street addresses and dispatches it as a Custom Designed or Next Day Service shipment under a service agreement (PS Form 5637, *Corporate Account/Custom Designed Agreement*) between the USPS and the mailer, subject to these standards:

- a. Service frequency is scheduled.
- b. The mailer is charged a Pickup on Demand fee each time mail is collected for reshipment from a post office, no matter how many post office boxes or business street addresses the mailer may have at that office.
- c. Express Mail postage and fees are paid by Express Mail Corporate Account or federal agency "Postage and Fees Paid" indicia. The sack or container and its contents are considered a single piece for calculation of the Express Mail price of postage and must not exceed 70 lbs.

- d. The mailer must keep a postage-due, Merchandise Return Service, or Business Reply Mail account at the postal facility where the post office box or business street address is located for any shortpaid, Merchandise Return Service, or Business Reply Mail. The service agreement (PS Form 5637) must state that such an account exists.
- e. Express Mail reshipment service is not available for Registered Mail, Certified Mail, COD, Insured Mail, or Express Mail items. The mailer must give instructions for redirecting such items on PS Form 1093, *Application for Post Office Box or Caller Service*, for mail originally addressed to post office boxes, or on PS Form 5637 for mail originally addressed to business street addresses.
- f. The service agreement must list the Expedited Service specialist at the originating office as the "Firm Representative" and show the pickup time is when the USPS employee gathers the mail and prepares it for dispatch as Express Mail.
- g. Commencement and termination of service agreements are subject to the standards for Express Mail Custom Designed Service.

DMM Revision: Clarification of Standards Relating to the Deposit of Mail

The Postal Service™ is revising *Mailing Standards of the United States Postal Service*, Domestic Mail Manual (DMM®) 604.4.5.3 as a reminder to mailers and to clarify the standards pertaining to the deposit of Priority Mail® items with postage affixed through a postage evidencing system, such as a postage meter or a PC Postage® product.

Standards in DMM 604.4.3.1 state that mailers using postage evidencing systems must affix an indicia on each mailpiece containing the exact amount due for the applicable rate category and associated criteria such as weight, shape, and zone or another amount permitted by mailing standards to qualify for worksharing or volume discounts. DMM 604.4.5.3 also allows all Priority Mail

pieces, with postage affixed through a postage evidencing system, to be deposited at any postal facility. To avoid the possible delay or the return of deposited mail, mailers are reminded that for Priority Mail pieces over 1 pound, and not in USPS-provided flat-rate packaging, postage must be affixed as described in DMM 604.4.3.1. Postage for Priority Mail pieces that are subject to zone rating must include the correct amount due, as calculated for weight, shape, and zone, from the ZIP Code where the mailpiece is deposited to the ZIP Code of the destination address.

IMM Revision: Priority Mail Large Flat-Rate Box — International

The price for shipping the Priority Mail Large Flat-Rate Box is based on the destination. For international mailing, there is one price for service to Canada and Mexico, and one price for service to all other countries.

We have rewritten parts 231 through 234 in their entirety to reflect the addition of the Priority Mail Large Flat-Rate Box.

Verifying U.S. Postal Service Money Orders

Follow these steps to cash a Postal Service™ money order:

1. Check that the amount does not exceed the legal limit: \$1,000 for domestic, and \$700 for international postal money orders.
2. Check that the proper security features are present:
 - When held to the light, a watermark of Benjamin Franklin is repeated from top to bottom on the left side.
 - When held to the light, a dark line (security thread) runs from top to bottom with the word “USPS” repeated.
 - There should be no discoloration around the dollar amounts, which might indicate the amounts were changed.

These appear in Postal Service Notice 299, *U.S. Postal Money Order Reference Card*, or online at <http://www.usps.com/missingmoneyorders/security.htm>.

3. If the money order seems suspicious, call the U.S. Postal Service Money Order Verification System at 866-459-7822.

Please provide this information to local banks and retailers, as they also receive Postal Service money orders for cashing.

Note: Mail order catalogs are prohibited as SAM or PAL mail.

A. Securities, currency, or precious metals in their raw, unmanufactured state are prohibited. Official shipments are exempt from this restriction.

A1. Mail addressed to "Any Servicemember," or similar wording such as "Any Soldier," "Sailor," "Airman," or "Marine"; "Military Mail"; etc., is prohibited. Mail must be addressed to an individual or job title such as "Commander," "Commanding Officer," etc.

B. PS Form 2976-A is required for all mail weighing 16 ounces or more, with exceptions noted below. In addition, mailers must properly complete required customs documentation when mailing any potentially dutiable mail addressed to an APO or FPO regardless of weight. The following are exceptions to the requirement for customs documentation on nondutiable mail that weighs 16 ounces or more:

- Known mailers are exempt from providing customs documentation on non-dutiable letters, and printed matter weighing 16 ounces or more. (A known mailer is anyone who legally applies a permit imprint to a mailpiece. Mail with meter postage is not considered to be from a known mailer.)
- All federal, state, and local government agencies are exempt from providing customs documentation on mail addressed to an APO or FPO, except for those APOs/FPOs to which restriction B2 applies.
- Prepaid mail from military contractors is exempt, providing the mailpiece is endorsed "Contents for Official Use — Exempt from Customs Requirements."

B1. PS Form 2976 or 2976-A is required. Articles are liable for customs duty and/or purchase tax unless they are bona fide gifts intended for use by military personnel or their dependents. When the contents of a parcel meet these requirements, the mailer must endorse the customs form, "Certified to be a bona fide gift, personal effects, or items for personal use of military personnel and dependents," under the heading, Description of Contents. **Exceptions:** All other exceptions listed in restriction B above are applicable to this restriction.

B2. All federal, state, and local government agencies must complete customs documentation when sending mail addressed to or from this APO or FPO weighing 16 ounces or more.

C. Cigarettes and other tobacco products are prohibited.

C1. Obscene articles, prints, paintings, cards, films, videotapes, etc., and horror comics and matrices are prohibited.

D. Coffee is prohibited.

E1. Medicines or vaccines not conforming to French laws are prohibited.

E2. Any matter depicting nude or seminude persons, pornographic or sexual items, or nonauthorized political materials is prohibited. Although religious materials contrary to the Islamic faith are prohibited in bulk quantities, items for the personal use of the addressee are permissible.

E3. Radio transceivers, cordless telephones, global positioning systems, scanners, base stations, and handheld transmitters are prohibited.

F. Firearms of any type are prohibited in all classes of mail. See definitions of firearms in DMM 601.11.1.2c. This restriction does not apply to firearms mailed to or by official U.S. government agencies. The restriction for mail to this APO/FPO ZIP Code does not apply to firearms mailed from this APO/FPO ZIP Code, provided ATF and USPS regulations are met. Antique firearms are a separate category defined in DMM 601.11.2 and ATF regulations; they do not require an ATF form.

F1. Privately owned weapons addressed to an individual are prohibited in any class of mail.

F2. Importation of firearms is restricted to one shotgun and one single shot.22 caliber rifle per individual.

G. Only First-Class Mail letters, Periodicals, and Standard Mail items are authorized.

H. Meats, including preserved meats, whether hermetically sealed or not, are prohibited.

H1. Pork or pork by-products are prohibited.

I. Mail of all classes must fit in a mail sack. Mail may not exceed the following dimensions:

- Maximum length 20 inches.
- Maximum width 12 inches.
- Maximum height 12 inches.

The maximum length and girth combined may not exceed 68 inches.

This restriction does not apply to registered mail and official government mail marked MOM.

I1. This restriction does not apply to registered mail.

I2. This restriction does not apply to official government mail marked MOM.

J. Parcels may not exceed 108 inches in length and girth combined.

K. Mail that includes in the address the words, "Dependent Mail Section," may consist only of letter mail, newspapers, magazines, and books. No parcel of any class containing any other matter may be mailed to the Dependent Mail section. This restriction does not apply if the address does not include the words "Dependent Mail Section."

L. All official mail is prohibited.

M. Fruits, animals, and living plants are prohibited.

N. Registered mail is prohibited.

O. Delivery status information for Extra Services is not available on USPS.com.

P. APO is used for the receipt and dispatch of official mail only.

Q. Mail may not exceed 66 pounds, and size is limited to 42 inches maximum length and 72 inches maximum length and girth combined.

R. All alcoholic beverages, including those mailable under DMM 601.8.0, are prohibited.

R1. Materials used in the production of alcoholic beverages (i.e., distilling material, hops, malts, yeast, etc.) are prohibited.

T. Mailings of case lots of food and supplemental household shipments must be approved by the sender's parent agency prior to mailing.

U. Parcels must weigh less than 16 ounces when addressed to Box R. This restriction does not apply to mail endorsed "Free Matter for the Blind or Handicapped."

U1. Mail is limited to First-Class Mail weighing 13 ounces or less when addressed to Box R. This restriction does not apply to mail endorsed "Free Matter for the Blind or Handicapped." Videotapes are prohibited when addressed to Box R, regardless of weight.

U2. Mail is limited to First-Class Mail letters only when addressed to Box R.

U3. Mail is limited to First-Class Mail correspondence (including voice and video cassettes), newspapers, magazines, photographs, not exceeding 16 ounces, when addressed to Box R.

V. Express Mail Military Service (EMMS) not available from any origin.

V1. Delivery Confirmation service is not available.

W. Meat products, such as dried beef, salami, and sausage, may be mailed, provided they remain in their original, hermetically sealed packages and bear USDA certification. Other meats, bones, skin, hair, feathers, horns or hoofs of hoofed animals, wool samples, tobacco leaves, including chewing and pipe tobacco, snuff, cigars, and cigarettes, or obscene material, including obscene drawings, photographs, films, and carvings, are prohibited. Exception: 200 grams of tobacco per parcel are permitted duty free.

X. Personal mail is limited to First-Class Mail items (to include audio cassettes and voice tapes) weighing 13 ounces or less. This limitation does not apply to official mail.

Y. Mail is limited to First-Class and Priority Mail items only. All Periodicals, Standard Mail items, and Package Services items (including SAM and PAL) are not authorized. This restriction also applies to official mail.

Z. No outside pieces (OSPs).

Z1. The following restriction is applicable only to International Service Centers (ISC)/Exchange Offices. An Anti-Pilferage Seal (Item No O817E or O818A) is required on all pouches and sacks.

IMM Revision: Priority Mail Large Flat-Rate Box – International (Continued)

232 Priority Mail International Flat-Rate Envelope

232.1 General

All items that may be sent as First-Class Mail International (see 241) may be sent in the Priority Mail International flat-rate envelope provided that the contents are mailable, that they fit securely in the envelope, and that they are entirely confined within the envelope with the provided adhesive as the means of closure. The envelope flap must be able to close within the prefabricated folds. Tape may be applied to the flap and seams for closure or to reinforce the envelope, provided the design of the envelope is not enlarged by opening the sides of the envelope and taping or reconstructing the envelope in any way. Registered Mail service is available. Insurance is not available.

232.2 Prices

The Priority Mail International flat-rate envelope is charged at a flat rate. The price does not depend on the weight of the item. Postage is required for each piece. Priority Mail flat-rate envelopes with prepaid postage may be used for international mail. Appropriate additional postage must be added prior to mailing. (See Exhibit 232.2.)

232.3 Weight Limit

The weight limit for the flat-rate envelope is 4 pounds.

232.4 Customs Forms Required

All Priority Mail International flat-rate envelopes must bear PS Form 2976 or PS Form 2976-A, depending on value.

233 Priority Mail International Flat-Rate Boxes

233.1 General

All mailable items that may be sent as Priority Mail International, except those items allowed in the Priority Mail International flat-rate envelope, may be sent in Priority Mail flat-rate boxes (see 231). The contents must fit securely and must be entirely confined within the box. The box flaps must be able to close within the prefabricated folds.

A flat-rate box may be insured. See 320 and Individual Country Listings for insurance availability, limitations, and coverage. Registered Mail service is not available.

233.2 Prices

A Priority Mail International flat-rate box is charged at a flat rate. The price does not depend on the weight of the item.

Postage is required for each piece. Exhibit 233.2 lists the prices for Priority Mail International flat-rate boxes.

233.3 Weight Limit

The weight limit for each flat-rate box is 20 pounds.

233.4 Customs Forms Required

Each Priority Mail International flat-rate box must bear a properly completed PS Form 2976-A.

234 Priority Mail International Parcels

234.1 General

Prices for parcels not using a flat-rate box vary by weight and country price group. See Individual Country Listings.

234.2 Indemnity

Ordinary — i.e., uninsured — Priority Mail International parcels include indemnity coverage against loss, damage, or rifling up to the amounts shown in Exhibit 234.4. Indemnity is limited to the lesser of the actual value of the contents or the maximum indemnity based on the weight of the article. If the parcel has been delivered to the addressee, payment for damage and missing contents is made to the addressee unless the addressee waives payment, in writing, in favor of the sender.

Note: International insured mail service provides insurance coverage higher than the indemnity limits for ordinary Priority Mail International parcels to many countries. See 320 and Individual Country Listings for availability and limitations of coverage. When international insurance is purchased, it replaces the ordinary indemnity coverage.

Note: Priority Mail International parcels and flat-rate boxes may be insured, but not the Priority Mail flat-rate envelope (see 322).

234.3 Exclusions

Ordinary indemnity coverage is not paid for:

- a. Parcels containing coins; banknotes; currency notes, including paper money; securities of any kind payable to the bearer; traveler's checks; platinum, gold, and silver; precious stones; jewelry; watches; and other valuable articles.

- b. Consequential losses, delay, concealed damage, spoilage of perishable items, articles improperly packaged, articles too fragile to withstand normal handling in the mail, or prohibited articles.

234.4 Ordinary Priority Mail International Weight and Indemnity Limits

Exhibit 234.4 lists the weight and indemnity limits for ordinary Priority Mail International parcels.

234.5 Mailing Locations

Parcels may be presented for mailing at any Post Office retail service counter.

234.6 Pickup Service

Scheduled pickup service is available for an added charge of \$14.25 for each pickup stop regardless of the number of pieces picked up. Only one pickup fee will be charged if domestic Express Mail, Express Mail International, domestic Priority Mail, Priority Mail International, Global Express Guaranteed, and/or domestic Parcel Post are also picked up at the same time. No pickup fee will be charged when Priority Mail International is picked up during a delivery stop or during a scheduled stop made to collect other mail not subject to a pickup fee. Pickup service is provided in accordance with the information in DMM 507.5; for more information, also visit the online site at www.usps.com/pickup.

234.7 Priority Mail International Online Prices

A discount of 5 percent will be applied to Priority Mail International published postage prices for transactions conducted on Click-N-Ship or through an authorized PC Postage vendor. The discount applies only to the postage portion of Priority Mail International prices. It does not apply to pickup service charges, insurance fees, or shipments made under an International Customized Mail agreement.

1-3.2 Organizations and Personnel

These policies apply to all Postal Service functional organizations and personnel, including Postal Service employees, contractors, vendors, business partners, and any other authorized users of Postal Service information systems, applications, telecommunications networks, data, and related resources. These policies also apply to the Office of the Inspector General (OIG) and the Inspection Service except where statutory authority exempts them.

For the purpose of these policies, the above entities are collectively known as **personnel**. This definition of “personnel” excludes customers whose only access is through publicly available services, such as public Web sites of the Postal Service.

These policies do not change the rights or responsibilities of either management or the unions pursuant to Articles 17 and 31 of the various collective bargaining agreements or the National Labor Relations Act, as amended. These revisions do not bar the unions from using their own portable devices and media for processing information that is relevant for collective bargaining and/or grievance processing, including information provided by management pursuant to Articles 17 and 31 of the collective bargaining agreement or the National Labor Relations Act. There is no change to policy concerning restricted access to the Postal Service Intranet.

CARS Indicia

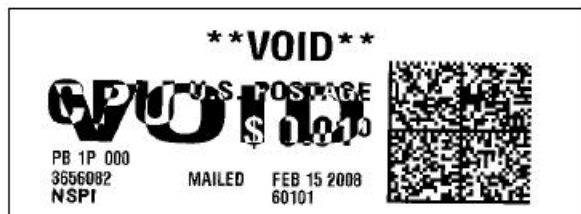
Contract Access Retail System (CARS) is a mailing system that has been implemented at selected performance-based contract postal units (CPUs). The deployment of CARS to 888 CPU locations was completed on January 30, 2008. CARS will continue to be deployed in new performance-based CPU locations.

CARS produces a postage label with the barcode on the right side as opposed to the left side. All CARS postage labels will have the letters "CPU" with the letters "PB" and the identifying number "1P" directly under the "CPU" letters.

CARS postage labels for all types of mail include the following information:

- Destination barcode.
- Origin ZIP Code™.
- Mail class.

An example of a CARS postage label is shown below.



Please post copies of this label on Postal Service™ bulletin boards so that employees can become familiar with these new labels, and please ensure that your employees are aware of the CARS postage labels now in use so that mail bearing this type of postage label does not encounter any delays.

Household Diary Study

The Postal Service's Household Diary Study (HDS), conducted since 1987, provides information about the contents of the mail sent and received by U.S. households. The Postal Service™ uses this information to help understand why and how customers use the mail. The results are used to:

- Forecast mail volume.
- Plan marketing strategies.
- Provide information for rate-setting purposes.

The HDS is administered at Headquarters by the Office of Demand Forecasting and Economic Analysis, Finance. NuStats, the HDS survey research firm contractor since July 1999, conducts the interviews and collects and analyzes the HDS data throughout the year.

HDS is a two-stage survey. Stage 1 is the Household Interview. NuStats sends an advance letter, signed by the postmaster general, to a representative sample of U.S. households. This letter emphasizes the importance of the HDS and asks for participation. These sample households are contacted either by telephone or in person and asked

about the mail they send and receive, their adoption and use of various communications' technologies, their attitudes about mail service in general, and information relating to their household and personal demographics. Those respondent households are recruited to participate in HDS Stage 2.

Stage 2 is the Mail Diary. NuStats asks households that agree to participate in Stage 2 to record information about the mail they send and receive for a 7-day period from Monday to Sunday. Information recorded includes number of mailpieces received and sent, industry mail source, mail characteristics, and attitudes regarding mail received. As an incentive for HDS Stage 2 participation, households are offered the options of receiving \$30 or a roll of 100 First-Class Mail® stamps.

Customers who participate in Stage 2 of the HDS can expect to receive their incentive about 2 months after they return the diary packet to NuStats.

Data gathered in both HDS stages is available in a final report, *The Household Diary Study — Mail Use and Attitudes*. The report is published in hard copy and a free

Pictorial Postmarks Announcement

As a community service, the Postal Service™ offers pictorial postmarks to commemorate local events celebrated in communities throughout the nation. A list of events for which pictorial postmarks are authorized appears below. If available, the sponsor of the pictorial postmark appears in italics under the date. Also provided are illustrations of those postmarks.

People attending these local events may obtain the postmark in person at the temporary Post Office™ station established there. Those who cannot attend the event but who wish to obtain the postmark may submit a mail order request. Pictorial postmarks are available only for the dates indicated, and *requests must be postmarked no later than 30 days following the requested pictorial postmark date.*

All requests must include a stamped envelope or postcard bearing at least the minimum First-Class Mail® postage. Items submitted for postmark may not include

postage issued after the date of the requested postmark. Such items will be returned unserved.

Customers wishing to obtain a postmark should affix stamps to any envelope or postcard of their choice, address the envelope or postcard to themselves or others, insert a card of postcard thickness in envelopes for sturdiness, and tuck in the flap. Place the envelope or postcard in a larger envelope and address it to: PICTORIAL POSTMARKS, followed by the NAME OF THE STATION, ADDRESS, CITY, STATE, ZIP+4® CODE, exactly as listed below (using all capitals and no punctuation, except the hyphen in the ZIP+4 code).

Customers can also send stamped envelopes and postcards without addresses for postmark, as long as they supply a larger envelope with adequate postage and their return address. After applying the pictorial postmark, the Postal Service returns the items (with or without addresses) under addressed protective cover.

How to Order the First Day of Issue Digital Color or Traditional Postmarks

Customers have 60 days to obtain the first day of issue postmarks by mail. They may purchase new stamps at their local Post Office™, by telephone at 800-STAMP-24, or at The Postal Store® Web site at www.usps.com/shop.

Traditional Postmarks

Customers should affix the stamps to envelopes of their choice, address them to themselves or others, or provide a self-addressed return envelope with sufficient postage

large enough to accommodate the canceled item. Mail the request to the corresponding city of issuance. There is no charge for the first 50 postmarks. There is a 5-cent charge for each additional postmark over 50. Customers should submit a check, money order, or credit card for payment. After applying the first day of issue postmark, the Postal Service™ will return the envelopes to the customer by U.S. Mail.

All postmark requests should go to the first day of issue city. The first day of issue city Post Office will then forward in bulk all postmark requests to Cancellation Services, Stamp Fulfillment Services, P.O. Box 449992, Kansas City, MO 64144-9992 by respective Post Offices.

Digital Color Postmarks

Only select stamp issues offer a digital color postmark. Customers may submit #6 or #10 envelopes constructed of paper rated as "laser safe." The Postal Service recommends envelopes of 80-pound Accent Opaque, acid-free, 9/16" side seams with no glue on the flap. The maximum size of all digital color postmarks is 2" high x 4" long. Allow sufficient space on the envelope to accommodate the postmark and do not use self-adhesive labels for addresses on the envelope. Two test envelopes must be included. There is a minimum of 10 envelopes at 50 cents per postmark required at the time of servicing. Customers should submit a check, money order, or credit card for payment.

The Postal Service reserves the right to not accept hand-painted and other cachet envelopes that are not compatible with our digital color postmark equipment. The Postal Service also reserves the right to substitute traditional black rubber postmarks if use of non-specified envelopes results in poor image quality or damage to equipment.

Customers should affix the stamps to the envelopes and address them to themselves or others for return through the mail. Or, they may include an additional self-addressed return envelope, large enough to accommodate their canceled items, with sufficient postage affixed for return of their postmarked items. Mail the request for a first day of issue digital color postmark to the corresponding city of issuance. Post Offices will then forward all customer requests for digital color postmarks to: Cancellation Services, Stamp Fulfillment Services, P.O. Box 449992, Kansas City, MO 64144-9992.

After applying the first day of issue postmark, the Postal Service will return the envelopes to the customer by U.S. Mail.
